Lent began on Ash Wednesday, March 5. This year we made two devotionals available, a weekly devotional suitable for the whole family and a daily devotional for adults:

For Families: Reflections on Prayer:



An Illustrated Lent for Families This printed devotional from Illustrated Ministries invites families to focus intentionally on the spiritual discipline of prayer during the Lenten season. By exploring different Gospel passages of Jesus engaged in prayer, families will be encouraged to learn new ways to expand and enrich their prayer experiences, individually, as a family, and in

community. Starting with Ash Wednesday and going through Easter, each weekly session has a scripture, reflection, discussion questions, activity, coloring page, and prayer.

For Adults:

Presbyterian Outlook's Grieving Change and Loss

Grief touches every corner of our lives — not just in moments of death but in quiet farewells, conflict, and lost health. Rooted in the wisdom of Elisabeth Kübler-Ross and David Kessler's six stages of grief, this 2025 Lenten devotional offers a pathway through the heartache of life's goodbyes, guiding you toward



the promise of resurrection. Each daily reflection, beginning with Ash Wednesday and culminating on Easter Sunday, will combine personal reflection, Scripture and prayer. THE LENTEN DESERT



During the Lenten season, which beg on Ash Wednesday (March 5 this year), Christians figuratively follow Jesus into the desert. Just as our Savior spent 40 days fasting and facing temptation, we focus on self-reflection and contrition.

In an 1873 hymn, Claudia Hernaman wrote, "O Lord, throughout these forty days, you prayed and kept the fast. Inspire repentance for our sin, and free us from our past."


The desert experience of Lent serves a clear purpose, filling us up rather than depleting us. "This is what Lent is meant to be,"

writes theologian Ron Rolheiser. "Time in the desert to courageously face the chaos and the demons within us and to let God do battle with them through us. The result is that we are purified, made ready, so the intoxicating joy of Easter might then bind us more closely to God and each other.

ON THE PATH TO VICTORY

After moving to a college town, Pastor Kendra Thompson learned about the athletic phenomenon known as March Madness. And after a nondenominational upbringing, as a young adult she learned about Lenten traditions.

Lent and the NCAA college basketball tournament, which usually coincide, both point to the divine, Thompson argues. "In Lent, with each day we are drawn closer to the crushing reality that we've crucified our God. And yet we are also faced with an impossible victory: that death did not win, that our God is raised in Jesus Christ," she writes. "Likewise,



watching college basketball invites us into a season of hoping in unlikely possibilities, marveling at upsets, and giving thanks to God for the connection we find as his people."

Like fans swept up in high-stakes games, Jesus' disciples abandon everything to follow him. Lent might be "holy madness," Thompson muses. It's "an opportunity to 'feel' our religion, not just in our heads but with our skin, our voices, even in the anxieties of our prayers."
